

Trees:

- All tree planting, trimming and removals are determined by City Parks Staff and the City's Urban Forest Division of Public Works, in consultation with the Preservation Director

Upright or vertical monuments and headstones obstruction code:

- All sides of the headstone or monument must be exposed, including the base
- They should be able to be seen from any direction
- There can be no plants of any type growing on the headstone or base
- Depending on the type of plant there should be a 1-2 foot space between plants and monuments to allow for seasonal growth and as determined by Parks Staff
- Monuments and headstones cannot be moved without the approval of the City Historian and the Preservation Director

Clearance for Flat stones:

- Flat stones cannot be covered by plant life or be shadowed throughout the day (either morning shade or afternoon shade can be acceptable, but not both morning or afternoon) by a bush or shrub
- Flat stones cannot be raised
- No plants can be planted closer than 12 inches to the stone (depending on the plot and determination of Parks Staff)

Plots, Surrounds and Pathways

- All plantings should be kept trimmed back so that plants do not grow over plot surrounds or in any way obstruct aisles/pathways.
- Any removal of cement covers on plots must be approved by Parks, the City Historian and Preservation Director

Climbing Plants

- To avoid plants growing on or covering cemetery stones, walls, mausoleum, fences or pathways, climbing plants cannot be located near (depending upon the growth pattern of the plant) any structure, headstone, walls, fences*, paths or mausoleum structures. No trellises are allowed in the plot areas. - - Climbing roses can be located along the outer fence of the Cemetery west of 9th Street near gate. *not including the outside perimeter fence surrounding the cemetery on Broadway, Muir or Riverside Blvd.
